Transgender Day of Remembrance: Gender SAFE, a Holland support group for Transgender and Gender Diverse individuals, as well as their family, friends and allies, will be holding a candlelight vigil in honor of Transgender Day of Remembrance. This vigil will be held to recognize and remember the lives of transgender people who have been killed in 2021 due to anti-transgender violence. The Rev. Bryan Berghoef of Holland UCC will be officiating. Sadly, there have already been 38 deaths of transgender individuals reported and recorded by the Human Rights Campaign this year. Please join us Saturday, November 20 from 7-8:30pm at the Centennial Park Gazebo in Holland.

WE'RE ON A MISSION!

Help our New Neighbors! Afghan Refugees will be headed to West Michigan and we've partnered with Bethany Christian Services to help with the resettlement of the 250 refugees. We will be collecting kitchen and bath items between now and Nov. 7 (yes—that soon!) to make Welcome baskets.

- Kitchen: new dish towels, sponges, disinfectant wipes, paper towels, small dust pan and whisk broom.
- Bath: shampoo, soaps, new hand and body towels.

It's a Wrap! We are also collecting wrapping supplies for the Love Christmas shop in December. We will need wrapping paper, bags, boxes, tape and tissue paper. All donations need to be to the church by November 21.

Feeding America: Coming to you Live, Curbside, December 9! We will be needing volunteers from 5:30-7:30. Come help feed the community and enjoy fellowship with your church family and friends.

Nestlings: The times are always changin'. We are still collecting diapers and wipes for our wee neighbors. Any and all sizes are needed, but larger sizes (for the less wee) are a particular need. Donations can be placed next to the Nestling diaper display in the narthex, or in the blue bucket by the church's back door.

Help Needed: We are still looking for someone to be our ServSafe person for the kitchen. We want to be able to provide meals to the community for celebrations, funerals and other gathering opportunities but need someone who can be our coordinator and work with our amazing kitchen people. HAND2HAND: Hand2Hand appreciates the support you, the congregation, have shown our program in getting the pantry up and running for this school year. We are currently serving 31 children from 24 families. Without the input of our usual fall food drive at Family Fare, we are especially looking for and dependent on other contributions. The local H2H organization and other food banks help, but your support is crucial to offering a variety of healthy food options to our children and families. A list of current needs can be found in the bulletin, Friday Church news, Congregator, and by the collection cart outside the Narthex. We always need the basics, and any items you may find on sale that are shelf safe and not too heavy are also appreciated. Anything we may not be able to use is donated to a local food pantry. Nothing goes to waste! This is a whole Church effort, so please remember us on your next shopping trip. You really have an impact on children's lives. Bless you.
